\*Child care is provided.

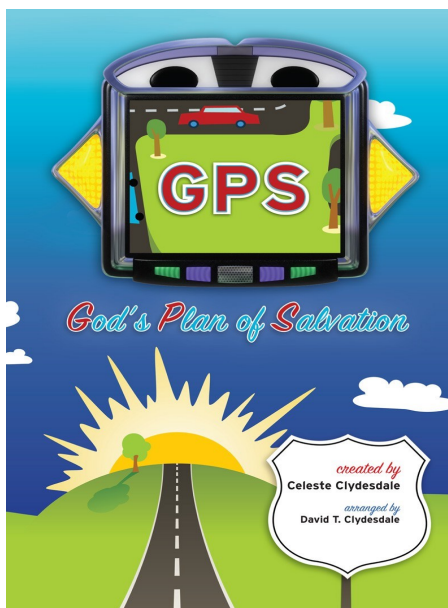

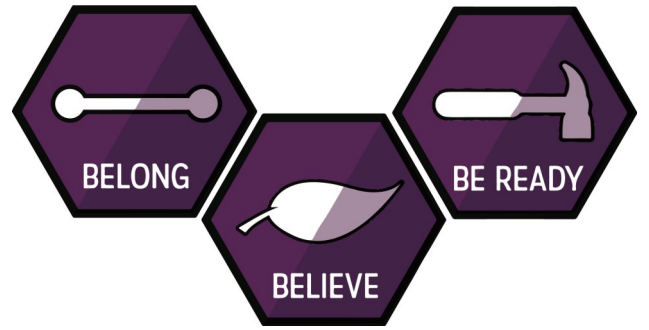
