## **Pete Kontra Begins As District Executive Minister & Installation Service**

Pete Kontra officially began office hours as the ANE District Executive Minister in January, 2018. An Installation Service will be held at Hempfield COB in Manheim on **Sunday, February 4<sup>th</sup> at 2pm.**

## **Brethren Disaster Ministries Work Sites for 2018**

Now is the time for your congregation to reserve a week to travel to a BDM work site to serve at a BDM rebuild project. Our ANE District has reserved weeks with BDM for our ANE congregations who wish to serve at BDM rebuild work sites in 2018. At this time BDM has two locations where they are working. One location is in Marion, South Carolina where Hurricane Matthew hit in October 2016. Marion County was one of the hardest hit areas, as well as one of the poorest. The other location is in Eureka, Missouri where Winter Storm Goliath caused a dangerous combination of heavy rain, snow and river flooding in December 2015. Historic water level records across the state of Missouri were set. This past spring, storms brought at least 10 inches of rain in 10 days causing over 250 roads to close under water, including a 57-mile stretch of Interstate 44. Hundreds of businesses and homes were damaged or destroyed, many of which had just recovered from the 2015 flooding. While these are the current work locations, BDM may choose to move to a different location during the course of 2018, depending upon the situation in other areas hit by recent storms and/or hurricanes. Congregations who sign up for a week of work may choose the BDM Disaster work site where they will serve. Contact Mary Etta Reinhart at 717-808-4306 for more details.
